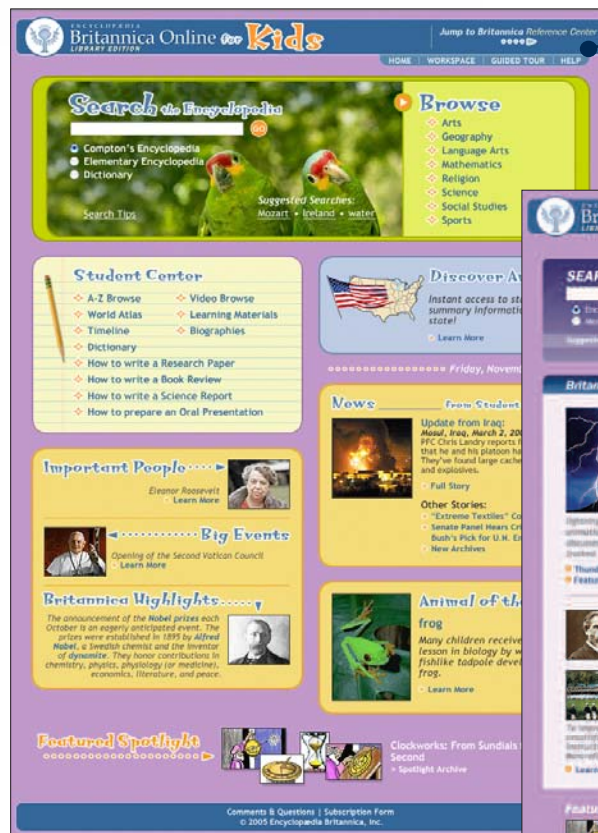

state of southeastern Australia, occupying both coastal mountains and interior tablelands. It is bounded by the Pacific Ocean to the east and the states of Victoria to the south, South Australia to ...

**Presbyterian Church of Wales** ->|  
church that developed out of the Methodist revivals in Wales in the 18th century. The early leaders were Howell Harris, a layman who became an itinerant preacher after a religious experience of ...

**New South Wales Corps** ->|  
(1789-1818), British military force formed for service in the convict colony of New South Wales. It was composed of the 10th Regiment of Foot, the 11th Regiment of Foot, and the 12th Regiment of Foot.
